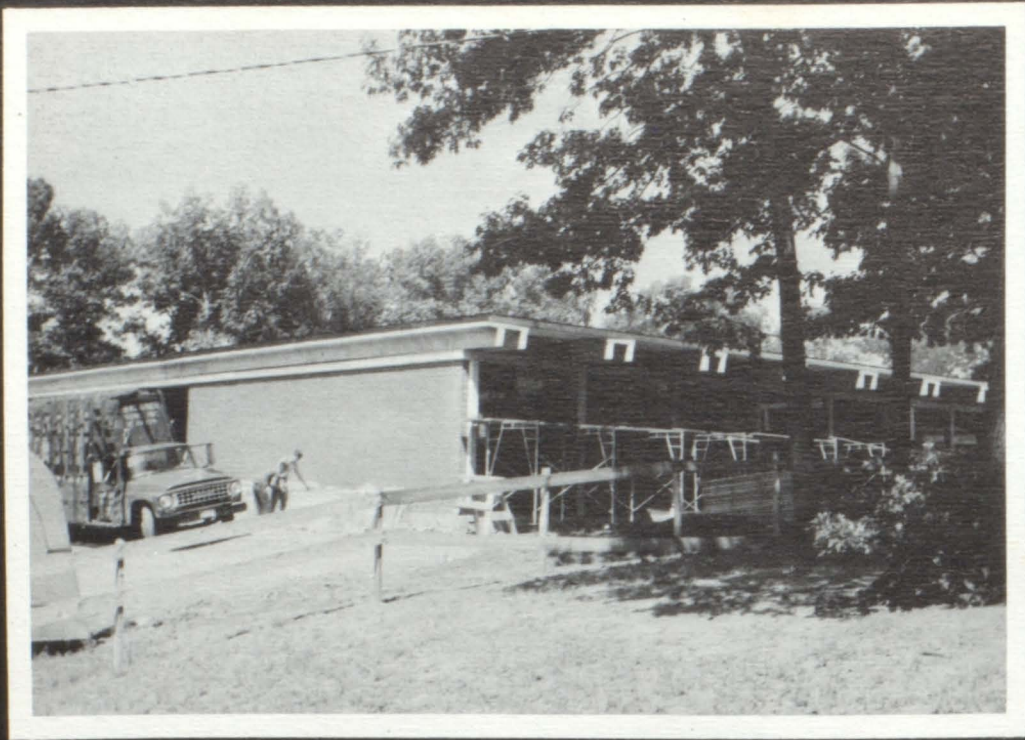
To You Mr. Church

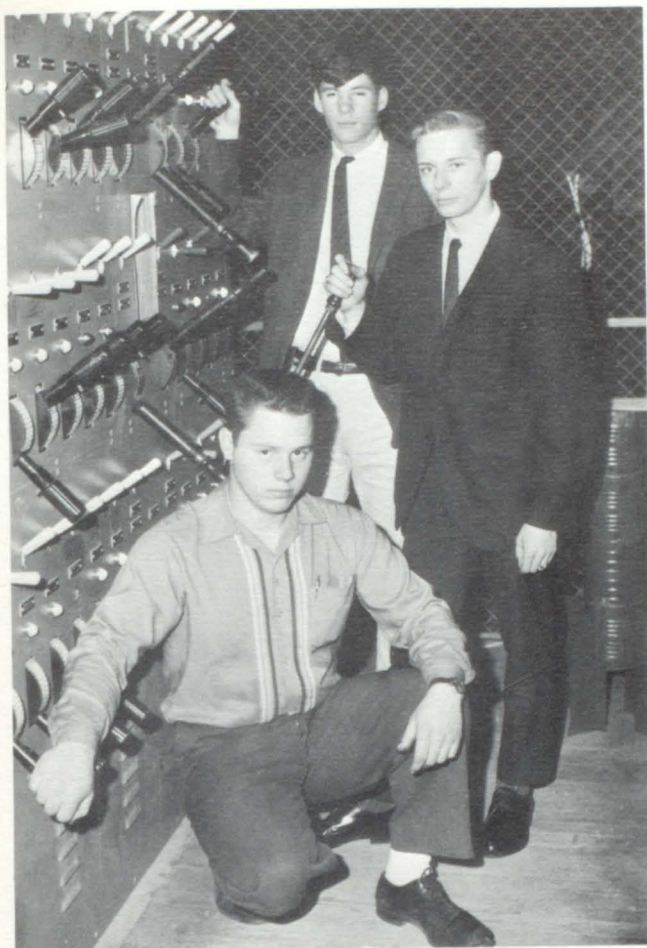
A-V Club

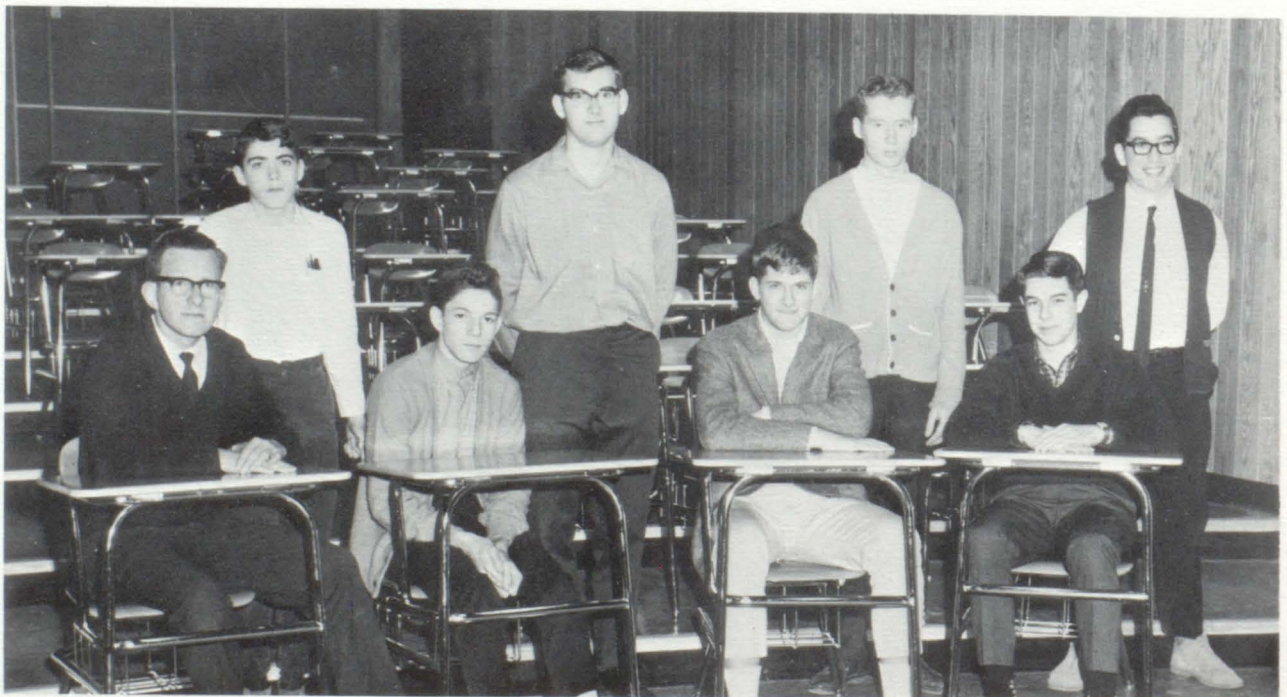


Chess Club
