
GYÖRGYEY THEATRE

This summer, as an A.F.S. exchange student I lived in Isfahan, Iran. My family there, the Chehrazis, consisted of six people; my two parents and my four brothers, who ranged in age from eight to twenty-two.

It's difficult for me now to explain the type of relationships that developed between me and my Iranian family. People are often shocked when they hear me refer to "my mother and father" or my "brothers". Yet these are the words which best describe how we grew to feel about each other. We still maintain a steady correspondence, as I'm sure we will for many years. Two of my brothers hope to come here soon to study, and I hope that somehow in the next few years I will be able to return to Isfahan.

Here, I only take six courses of my own choice. I have enjoyed the free periods very much - it has given me time to talk to friends, write letters, study, etc.










FIELD HOCKEY

In the early 70's an increasing concern of the Special Education Dept. was the number of older trainable mentally retarded (T.M.R.) students within the system. Until this time these students had been housed at the elementary level. The range of chronological ages (14–20) was now becoming inconsistent with educational philosophy and the learning and social processes. In 1971 a unique program for secondary pre-vocational training was begun at the East Campus.

In the four years since its inception, many significant gains have evolved. Students are integrated into several aspects of high school life. They take Wood Shop, Physical Education, and Home Economics. They are responsible for "job stations" in the cafeteria and library and assist in clerical duties and building maintenance throughout East Campus — always with the objective of increasing pre-skill and social development. Within their classroom the students work at individual levels to reinforce the basic academics necessary for life. Through the efforts of a conscientious administration and staff, and a responsive and responsible student body, the T.M.R. students have become an integral part of the total school community.
