





Guidance Department




All these books and publications are well arranged and easily accessible.






All-State Musicians




By means of the Pep Club, girls in grades seven through twelve found an outlet to display and help create more school spirit. Miss DeGrande supervised the group and its activities.


Bowling





BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT


