Strategic Planning Process

In January 2024, the North Haven Memorial Library engaged Maxine Bleiweis & Associates (MB&A) to facilitate the strategic planning process. This process began with a community and organizational assessment completed in May 2024. This assessment gathered information from more than 500 members of the North Haven community through surveys, interviews, and focus groups, as well as census and other existing reports and data. The organizational assessment included staff input, review of policies and procedures, and observation. In addition, a Community Advisory Group was convened to provide feedback on the findings. The assessment found that the North Haven Memorial Library had the potential to meet the following community needs:



Increase social cohesion and sense of belonging



Provide a community hub and spaces to gather to meet a variety of needs for all ages and stages of life



Provide opportunities for community members to connect through meaningful shared experiences



Inspire curiosity and openness within the community and beyond

In August 2024, a Work Group made up of six staff members and three Board members was formed to use the information gathered in the assessment to draft the Library's Strategic Plan. Over the course of five meetings held between August 28th and December 5th, the Work Group reviewed the results of the community needs that had been identified through the process, developed proposed mission and vision statements, selected service priorities, drafted goals and objectives, and reviewed activities and foundational strategies. In addition, the NHML staff were engaged in the process through an all-staff meeting focused on the development of action steps to be used for accomplishing goals. The Community Advisory Council met on October 29th to review the strategic priorities and offer feedback on how the Library's efforts can be augmented through community partnerships.

Strategic Planning Process

TIMELINE

PHASE 1 - COMMUNITY, STAFF, & POLICY ASSESSMENTS

JANUARY 2024

The North Haven Memorial Library engaged Maxine Bleiweis & Associates (MB&A) to facilitate the strategic planning process. A detailed timeline was established, and a data collection survey was developed.

FEBRUARY 2024

Key Informant interviews were completed. Four focus groups including business owners, parents and caregivers of young children, 7th graders, and general adult library users, were conducted. The Community Survey was disseminated.

MARCH - APRIL 2024

Staff assessments, meetings, and interviews were completed and SOAR goals were created. Policy and procedure reviews were completed. The first Community Advisory Council meeting was held. The Community and Organizational Assessment Report was completed.

PHASE 2 - CREATION & APPROVAL OF THE PLAN

AUGUST - SEPTEMBER 2024

The Strategic Plan Work Group was convened. Multiple meetings were conducted to assess the data collected in Phase 1. The Work Group began to create goals and objectives.

OCTOBER - DECEMBER 2024

The Second Community Advisory Council meeting was held to offer feedback and assess if tentative goals aligned with needs of the community. The Library's new Mission, Vision, and Values were created. The first draft of the Plan was written.

JANUARY - MAY 2025

Work continued on the Strategic Plan draft. An Action and Assessment Framework was created. MBA and the Library Director presented the completed Strategic Plan to the Library Board, and NHML received approval of the Strategic Plan.

JUNE - NOVEMBER 2025

The staff continued work on the Action and Assessment Framework. NHML officially launched the Strategic Plan to the public in November 2025.

The adoption of a new strategic plan offers the Library a valuable opportunity for thoughtful self-reflection, starting with a shared understanding of its **mission**—what the Library does—its **vision**—what it aspires to be—and core **values** as an integral part of the North Haven community.

Presented below and approved by the Library Board on May 15, 2025, these statements will steer the Library's work over the next three years and provide direction as it adapts to an ever-changing environment.

Promote Lifelong Learning

Community members of all ages will feel supported and engaged in learning opportunities that meet them at their individual life stages so that they can access the resources they need to be successful in school, work, and life.









Offer services that support families and the community to develop the knowledge, skills, and confidence necessary to support children's and teen's learning.

Expand partnerships with groups that offer lifelong learning opportunities to identify and fill gaps in community learning.

Expand and cultivate opportunities that build essential life skills.



Spark Curiosity & Encourage Imagination

Community members will encounter reading, viewing, and listening materials, programs, and hands-on experiences that spark their interest, reflect and expand their perspectives, and enrich their lives through skill-building and fun.

Develop, build, and maintain collections and resources that are relevant and engaging.

Encourage users of all ages to participate in hands-on activities, skill-building, and active play.

Increase the awareness that community members have of the Library's programs, collections, and services.











Putting the Plan Into Action

During the planning process, the Work Group, staff, and Community Advisory Group identified hundreds of potential activities and initiatives designed to bring the Strategic Plan to life. The resulting activities are grouped into four key categories that provide the plan's framework: marketing and communications, community outreach, staff alignment, and physical/virtual space planning.

The Strategic Plan will be carried out in three phases – Assessment, Alignment, and Action.

1

PHASE ONE: ASSESSMENT

NHML will focus on assessing its current activities as they relate to each objective and each of the four categories. For example, the first objective under Create Community Connections is to "diversify types of materials, displays, and programming that include North Haven community members' contributions."

In Phase One, staff will assess how this is currently being done and what changes may need to be made in how the Library communicates/markets opportunities, who from the community is currently engaged and who will need to be engaged, how staff are currently deployed to do this work, and what spaces are available to achieve the objective.





PHASE TWO: ALIGNMENT

NHML will focus on aligning the work it does with the objectives by potentially changing communications/marketing methods, engaging community members and organizations more effectively, shifting library work responsibilities, and altering or updating spaces to meet the identified needs.



PHASE THREE: ACTION

NHML will begin to carry out the activities that lead to the accomplishment of each objective and ultimately its goals. Each objective will have an associated measurement so that progress can be tracked.

In each phase, the Library will work closely with the community, including the Community Advisory

Council, to develop ways to receive feedback on its progress and learn about new needs that arise in North Haven.

The timeline for each of these phases will vary and will be cyclical, with activities being assessed and re-aligned as needed.

In tandem with the implementation of the Strategic Plan and based on community feedback, NHML will be making significant improvements to its physical spaces. In 2024, the Library received a State Library Construction Grant and expects renovations to begin in the fall of 2025. These updates are designed to support the Strategic Plan's Vision and Objectives. The improvements include a larger Teen space featuring modular seating, a dedicated gaming center, and computer stations exclusively for teen use. A combined Information and Circulation desk will streamline service. An expanded café area will offer a more inviting, casual setting. Three new study rooms will be constructed on the second floor to further support independent and collaborative learning and provide meeting space. Additionally, the installation of a high-capacity generator will enhance the Library's role as a community hub, ensuring it can provide power, internet, and climate control during storms and emergencies. Throughout the majority of the renovation period, NHML will remain open. While some services may be temporarily affected, staff are committed to minimizing disruptions, maintaining accessibility, and extending library services into community spaces.
